  - The Village Elections will be on Tuesday, March 21<sup>st</sup> 2023 from noon to 9PM at the Ann Bornt Municipal Building.

# MAYOR UPDATES

 Route 7 is reopened: After several weeks of round-the-clock construction, NYS DOT has officially reopened Route 7. I would personally like to thank all the various DOT officials who took calls, answered questions, and gave us detailed progress updates. Specifically I wanted to thank Bryan Viggiana (Regional Public Information Officer) and Pat Barnes (Regional Director, Region 1) for the availability and information. I also want to thank Rensselaer County for their assistance, including Jay Wilson and Rich Crist; the Hoosick Falls Police Department for their incredible and consistent response to the situation, the NYSP and Rensselaer County Sheriff's Office for their assistance keeping an eye on Hill Road and Route 22 outside of the Village, and both local businesses JC Tractor and Doug's Oil for offering parking for local residents who lost their on street parking.

- 2. NY Forward Grant: The Village officially joined with Jasen Von Guinness in submitting an application to Round 7 of the Restore NY Grant Program. Jasen, Samantha Graves and Richard Brownell were a great team to work with as we jointly worked on the submission, as was Rensselaer County. We would like to thank County Executive McLaughlin, County Attorney CJ Kempf, County Operations Director Rich Crist, and the entire County Legislature, including local Jeff Wysocki and Bruce Patire. It was a solid group effort from all levels of local government coming together to bring improvements to our community and support our local businesses. Thanks to all involved.
- 3. Woods Brook Flood Remediation Program (\$2 million dollar program awarded in December of 2017 by New York State after the July 2017 Flood. The three tiers: \$1,000,000 Buyout Program; \$900,000 remediation program with the Town of Hoosick to slow upstream waters; and \$182,000 to design a flood plain restoration project. Tier 2 has been completed/closed out):
  - Buyout Program: We have heard from Siena Fencing that they are hoping to come out during the middle of next week and install the fencing at 107/115 Main Street. Once the fencing is complete, the Village will work to close out the Woods Brook Buyout Program.
  - **b.** Flood Plain Restoration Project Design: We had a meeting with DEC/SLR Consulting to hear updates on the design work going on for possible next steps for flood plain improvements to the Woods Brook area. A new focus includes the Woods Brook area between Elm Street and the Army Corp of Engineers culvert, along Spring Street.
  - c. With the \$1 million buyout program wrapping up soon, and the Flood Plain Restoration Project Design looking to be finalized, our focus will shift to applying for funding through the CFA program, using the completed design work. Applications are generally due in July of 2023.
- **4.** Elm Street/Railroad Avenue Stop Signs installed: Thanks to our DPW Staff for installing the stop signs at this intersection. This effort is the result of citizens speaking out about safety concerns, Trustees doing the research and agreeing with the need of action, and was ordered last month via a Board of Trustees Resolution.
