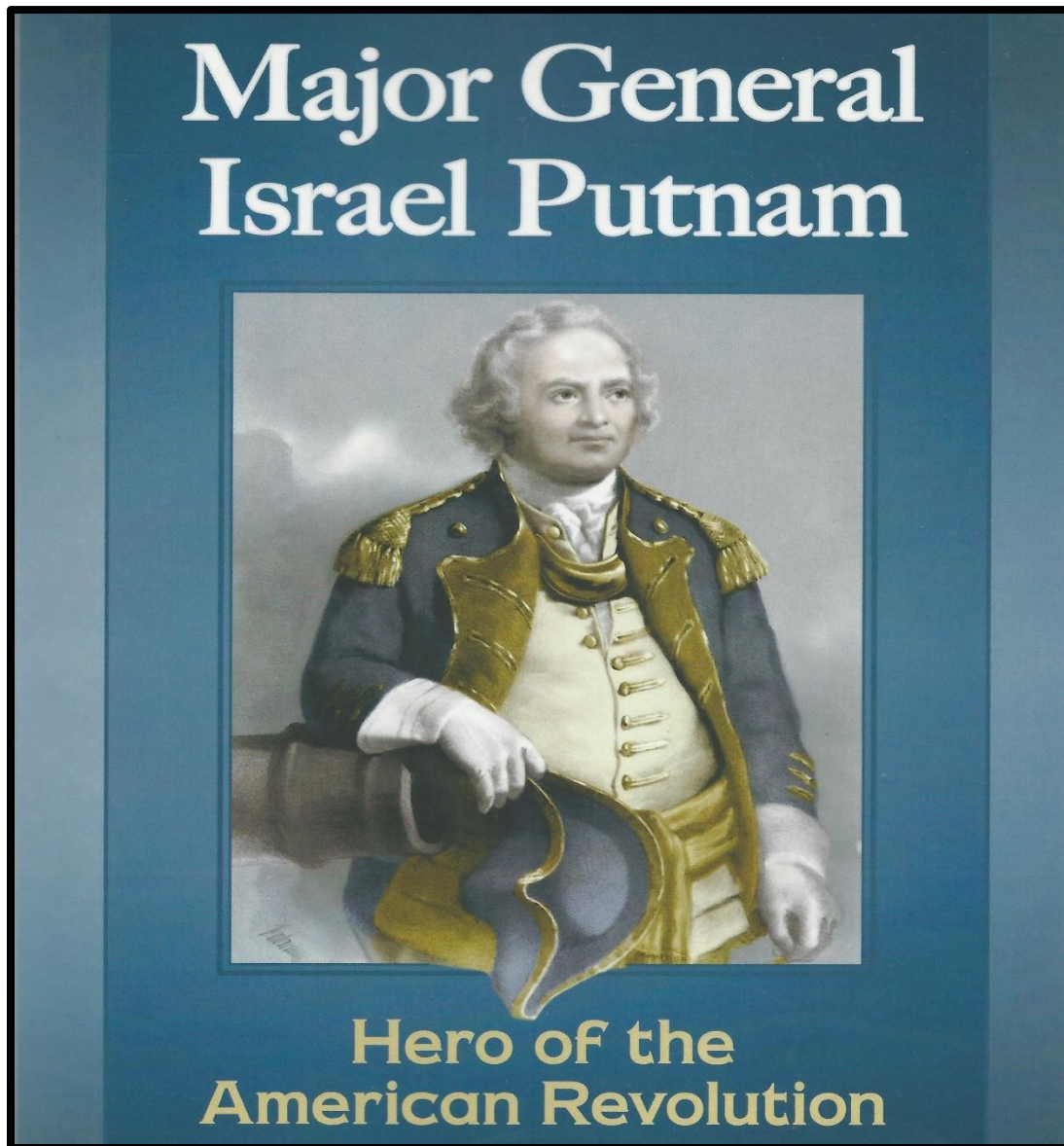

A colorful figure of 18th-century America, Israel Putnam played a key role in both the French and Indian War and the American Revolutionary War. In 1758 he barely escaped from being burned alive by Mohawk warriors. It was Putnam who reportedly gave the command “Don’t fire until you see the whites of their eyes” at the Battle of Bunker Hill.
