- Spring Brush Pickup: Our second year in a row offering a spring brush pickup will begin on Monday, April 1st and run through Monday, April 15th. This pickup is limited to leaves, grass clippings, and branches (4" diameter or less only) that fell due to the winter weather. Brush piles should be next to the road or sidewalk. Paper bags are ok, but no plastic tags will be taken.

MAYOR UPDATES

- 1. NYS DEC/DOH GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY: It was an honor to join NYS DEC Commissioner Basil Seggos, NYS DOH Commissioner Dr. James McDonald, Hoosick Town Supervisor Surdam, CWPG Co-Chairs Patrick Dailey and Chris Bettis, community member Michael Hickey, and many others for an official groundbreaking ceremony for the new waterline construction project. Many members of the Board and community were there, as were DPW Superintendent Holbrook, WTP Operator Hurlburt, and Environmental Attorney David Engel. As mentioned previously, the project hopes to be complete around the end of the calendar year.
- 2. NY Forward: We expect to soon receive approval from the state for LPC (Local Planning Committee) membership, likely in the next week. Once we receive this, LPC members will then take part in a live LPC Training Webinar (two opportunities in mid-May, should neither work, members will review one of the two recorded meetings after the fact), and then will be looking to have the first LPC meeting in late May/early June.
- **3.** Village Newsletter: We have gotten our first newsletter out with some big updates for the Village. Thanks to the entire Board who put a great deal of work, whether it be working on the drafts and the content (Trustees Walraed, Sauer, and Schuttig) and review/proofreading (Trustees Alter, Hanselman, and Deputy Mayor Ryan). Solid group effort all around! Our goal is to make this a regular occurrence, meaning the next one would be a Fall newsletter in August.
